A seven-member delegation of the Parliamentary Select Committee on Communications from the Parliament of Ghana led by the Hon (Mrs) Cynthia Mamle Morisson, MP, is presently on a study visit to the Mauritius National Assembly.

The mission is being undertaken in the context of the implementation of the DAWA Project and also seeks to look into other bilateral agreements initiated between Mauritius and Ghana.

In this context, Members of the delegation will interact with policy makers and other stakeholders concerned with a view to benchmarking on best practices to facilitate the establishment of an ICT Park in Ghana.

Welcoming the Members of the delegation on Monday 14 August during the courtesy call, Hon Sooroojdev PHOKEER, GCSK, GOSK, the Speaker of the National Assembly highlighted that it is always heart-warming to receive our brothers and sisters from the African continent. During the meeting, the delegates exchanged views on the objectives of their visit and parliamentary practices with Mr Speaker.

The delegates will have meetings with Officials of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and International Trade, Senior Officers of the Ministry of Finance, Economic Planning and Development and Officials of the Ministry of Information Technology, Communication and Innovation.

Moreover, meetings with the Chairman and the Deputy CEO of the Economic Development Board, the Chairman and Officer in charge of the Mauritius Africa Fund, and the Secretary-General of the Mauritius Chamber of Commerce also form part of the programme of visit.

During the study visit, the delegates will undertake guided visits to the Aapravasi Ghat World Heritage Site and the Le Morne Cultural Heritage Landscape and Monument of Nature.
