Opening of In-Lagoon Fishing Activities in the regions affected by the MV Wakashio Oil Spill

The Ministry of Blue Economy, Marine Resources, Fisheries and Shipping wishes to inform the public and in particular registered and applicant fishers, that in-lagoon fishing activities from Pointe Canon to Vieux Grand Portwill resume as from **Monday 06 September 2021**.

The attention of registered and applicant fishers concerned is drawn to the fact that access will not be allowed within a radius of 500 metres from the MV Wakashio wreck site

In view of the COVID-19 situation prevailing in Mauritius, registered and applicant fishers should observe all sanitary precautions during their fishing activities.

For their safety, registered and applicant fishers shall wear their life jackets for the whole duration of the fishing trips.

The Ministry relies on the collaboration of all for the smooth resumption of the fishing activities.
