VOCATIONAL EXAMINATIONS 2022

- The Vocational Examinations 2022 for prospective barristers, attorneys and notaries, conducted by the Council for Vocational Legal Education under the Law Practitioners Act 1984 will be held from <u>Monday 18 April 2022</u> to <u>Friday 06 May</u> <u>2022</u>.
- 2. Registration for the above examinations will take place at the seat of the Council (6th Floor, Supreme Court Building, **Edith Cavell Street**, Port-Louis) from **10 00 to 14 00 hours on 22, 23, 24 and 25 February 2022.**
- 3. A qualified person can register for only **one** of the three examinations.
- 4. Candidates having been unsuccessful at previous CVLE examinations will be allowed to register for the April 2022 examinations upon good cause being shown to the satisfaction of the Council as per the Council Rules of Examinations.
- 5. The documents to be produced when registering are as follows:
- □ Birth Certificate (Original + photocopy)
- □ Marriage Certificate (Original + photocopy) (if applicable)
- □ National Identity card (Original + photocopy)
- □ Law degree (Original + photocopy)
- □ Two recent passport-size colour photographs
- □ A certificate of attendance from the accredited person
- □ Prospective candidates at 4 above must produce documentary evidence regarding previous unsuccessful attempts at CVLE Examinations.
- 6. A fee of Rs 10,000/- is payable in respect of the above examinations at the time of registration. A fee of Rs 5,000/- is payable at the time of registration for candidates who are entitled to resit for one paper. These fees are not refundable.
- 7. No candidate will be allowed to register after 25 February 2022.

- 8. Save and Except prospective candidates at 4 above, no candidate will be allowed to register for the Vocational Examinations if his/her attendance during the vocational course provided by the accredited person is less than 80%.
- Time tables and Index Numbers will be delivered by <u>Wednesday 06 April 2022</u> at the seat of the Council and candidates who do not receive same should contact the Secretary forthwith.
- 10. Candidates having obtained **Grade A** in the oral test for Advocacy at last year's Vocational Examinations and who wish to be exempted from sitting for the said Advocacy Examination again should submit a written application to that effect to the Council **at the time of registration**.
- 11. Prospective candidates are informed that examinations will be held under strict sanitary and hygienic conditions as applicable in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.
