Renewal of Licences

The public is hereby informed that in accordance with Section 166A of the Road Traffic Act, a Petrol Service Station Licence:

- a) shall be valid for a period of one year;
- b) may be renewed every year; and
- c) a holder of a Petrol Service Station Licence who does not intend to renew his/her licence, shall, not later than 14 days before the expiry of the licence, give notice, by registered post or by email on nta@govmu.org to the NLTA of his/her intention not to have his/her licence renewed.

Accordingly, any holder of a private Petrol Service Station Licence, who has failed to renew his/her licence after the expiry date, a surcharge of 50% calculated on that fee will be applicable, subject to date of expiry.

Holders of Petrol Service Station Licences are also informed that the renewal of Petrol Service Station Licences shall be effected upon production of a valid Fire Certificate from the Mauritius Fire and Rescue Services.
