## Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Regional Integration and International Trade of the Republic of Mauritius Africa Day Message 2022

The 25<sup>th</sup> May 2022 marks the 59<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of the Organisation of African Unity and the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its successor, the African Union. Today, Mauritius joins the rest of Africa in celebrating Africa Day.

The role of our organisation in the last two decades has been shaped by the need of the moment, and this year's theme dedicated to "Strengthening nutritional resilience and food security on the African continent: strengthening Agri-food, health and social protection systems for the acceleration of the development of human, social and economic capital development.", is an appropriate response to the pressing food security and related challenges being faced by our continent.

While reinventing itself, we are heartened that the spirit of solidarity and unity which characterised the OAU continues to pervade our Union, as it constantly faces evolving economic, peace and security, developmental and sanitary challenges. Mauritius strongly believes that the implementation of the AfCFTA, a crucial driver for inclusive economic growth, job creation and sustainable development, will lead to the positive transformation of many African economies. We have no doubt that the AfCFTA will further boost trade and investment.

The universal values of democracy, good governance, the rule of law, the promotion and protection of human rights have been at the core of our development. In line with our commitment to upholding good governance, last January Mauritius presented its Progress Report on the implementation of the African Peer Review Mechanism.

As we celebrate Africa Day, the Government of the Republic of Mauritius would like to reiterate its deep appreciation to the Member States of the African Union for their unflinching support to its relentless struggle to complete the decolonization of the Republic of Mauritius so that it can effectively and fully exercise its sovereignty over the Chagos Archipelago.
